Students that have a job or would like a job can earn school credit for graduation and earn a paycheck when they take internship.

What is Internship?

Internship is a paid work experience of at least minimum wage. The goal of internship is to give students on the job real world work experience in a field of their choice.

Internship can be the ticket to a new job. Some internship students will have the opportunity to be hired full-time or continue to work part time at the end, assuming you've done a good job.

Why Internship?

- Allows you to explore potential careers and courses of study before you go to college or trade school and pay high tuition cost.
- Strengthen your working skills
- Help build your resume
- Increase your marketability
- Expand your network and gain professional references

Dakota Internship

Internship / Co-op: For students to be in the Internship program, they must have had 2 semesters of program related classes before their senior year. Also, take a related course during their senior year each semester. Students can sign up for Internship through most CTE programs. Be sure to see the Course Description book for course numbers and prerequisites for Internship and the related classes. Students may take 1 or 2 hours of Internship and be dismissed from school after 4th or 5th hour. Students are not required to report to work every day but needs 100 hours a semester or average 5 hours per week. Students receive pay of at least minimum wage and earn credit for graduation.
